Thank you for taking the time to fill in this form. It would be appreciated if you are interested, to have it submitted by Friday 24 February.



SCIENCE AT MNCC IS ON FIRE

The Year 10 Science class performed an experiment on colour emissions by metals.

When electrons are in their electron shells/cloud they are said to be in the ground state or state of rest but when they get excited through heat energy and they move to higher energy/electron shells. Then when they get back to their ground state the energy released is displayed by a specific colour for that particular atom/element. That is how different colours are observed for different elements in their salts.

ART IS EXPLODING WITH COLOUR

This term, the Year 9s and 10s are exploring a blend of digital and traditional methods for creating Pop Art. Based on Andy Warhol's iconic style and following a stencil-screen printing method, students are using Adobe Photoshop to design their own Pop Art stencils. These stencils will then be printed and cut.

In these photos, Visual Arts Teacher Joshua Peckover is leading a demonstration with students of how to use a squeegee to push screen-printing ink through a silkscreen, through a stencil, and onto paper. The paper is then dried and a second layer with a different colour ink is applied, to create a layered image. Practically, this method allows for the creation of large-scale series of prints, and is often used for printing designs onto t-shirts, something that the Year 9s and 10s will be doing later this term.

MATHS ONLINE PROGRAM

Maths Online is a new program used from Year 1 – Year 5 to help fill in learning gaps that happen over time. It is an online program where students can complete diagnostic tests to find the gaps in their knowledge, then their teacher sets appropriate tasks for each individual student in which they first watch a video about the topic before completing questions, trying to gain stars and master the topic.

The great thing about this program is it gives them instant feedback. If they answer something incorrectly and if they are still unsure, their teacher can work through the questions with them. The program also comes with additional games to practice fluency with addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, as well as some problem-solving games too. Not all Maths lessons are using this program as we realise that students needs hands-on problem solving skills too so other lessons in the week are with the teacher playing Maths games and completing investigations. Parents can log on with their child's login at home and access their results from the results tab on the home screen. 
