As unusual and interesting as this Easter was, the one thing that stood out for me was that it reminded me that Jesus Christ came for all people, including those from Australia and those from Finland. The message of Easter remains the same for us this Easter. Christ died for our sin and came back to life again to give us all new life and hope for eternity. ANCIENT ROMAN ARCHAEOLOGY DIG




