Food Allergy Week

Food Allergy Week is an initiative of A&AA and is dedicated to promoting community understanding of food allergy to help protect those at risk. Australia has the highest incidence of food allergy in the world, and it's growing at a rapid rate with the country seeing a 7% year on year increase in food allergy fatalities over the last 15 years. We estimate that there are more than 500,000 Australians with a diagnosed food allergy and many more undiagnosed. The theme for Food Allergy Week 2023 is adrenaline injector first for anaphylaxis, asthma reliever second: a life-saving order. Many people that have both food allergy and asthma sometimes confuse anaphylaxis for asthma. If you have food allergy and asthma and you experience sudden breathing difficulty within a few hours after eating, always use your adrenaline injector first and then your asthma reliever puffer. If in doubt, give adrenaline injector first. Be careful, not fearful. Allergies can be life threatening but there are a number of things you can do to help reduce the risk of an allergic reaction.



KINTSUGI ART

Last week the Year 8's worked on a new art project: Kintsugi art! This is the Japanese method of repairing broken pottery or ceramics using gold.

On Thursday 11 May, the students broke out of their comfort zones as they also broke some side plates (under Mr. Peckover's close supervision of course). They then carefully glued them back together using hot-glue guns, and over the following two weeks they've be painting or drawing the story of Creation and the Fall on the pieces between the cracks.
