



Head Lice Policy & Procedure Policy

Head lice (pediculosis) are tiny insects that live on the human scalp where they feed and breed. While they do not carry or transmit disease, they are a cause of head itching and scratching, which may lead to infection and swollen lymph glands; therefore, need to be controlled. Our aim is to respond to reports of head lice quickly and effectively, and to ensure that parents and guardians are well informed about head lice treatment.

Procedure

As part of the enrolment process, parents/guardians give signed permission in the Enrolment Application Form to have their child's hair checked for head lice.

- If a child is suspected to have head lice, they are checked by the Student Services staff member. If they have not given permission, parents/guardians are asked to come and check their child's hair.
- If the child has live lice, the parents are contacted and asked to collect their child from the College. They are to treat them before their child can return to the College.
- If a child has no live lice, but does have live eggs, the parents are contacted and asked to collect their child from the College. They are to treat them before their child can return to the College.
- If parents/guardians are unable to collect the child straight away, the child is to complete work in a separate area in the Office.
- A letter will go to the families of the child's class to alert them that a case has been found and to check their child's hair. (Appendix C)
- When the child returns to school, the Student Services staff member will check their hair. If the child does not have any live lice or live eggs, they can return to class. If the child still has live lice or live eggs, parents will be contacted to collect the child from the College.
- A copy of the Head Lice Check Report sheet (Appendix A) is given to the parent/guardian to be returned signed once treated.
- If the child has been sent home after having live lice or live eggs and the parent/guardian has treated the child's hair (proof of this is the signed Head Lice Check Report Sheet parents fill in) and eggs are still found in the hair, the child can go back to class but the parent/guardian must re-treat the child in 6 days and must complete the second Head Lice Check Report Sheet (Appendix B) indicating that they have done the re-treatment.

HEAD LICE CHECK REPORT SHEET

Your child was checked today by our Student Services staff member for the presence of Head Lice.

Head Lice Notification

Dear Parents & Caregivers

It has come to the attention of the College that there has been a case of head lice in your child's class. If you become aware that your child has head lice, please report it to the College.

We ask that you check your child's hair and treat as required. If you find eggs or lice in a child's hair, it will be necessary to treat the entire family as other members may only be at the egg stage.
