#### Dear Parents and Guardians

#### **AVIATION**

Term 2 Aviation Weeks were full of wonderful experiences for our students. In Week 3, our excursions saw the students visit the South Australian Aviation Museum and general aviation engineering company Aviation Engines as well as AeroTech who supply and service the air fleet for the SES.

We are so grateful to these career pathways partners for welcoming our students to view some pretty special areas of aviation. Our Week 3 group were able to complete their first of 2 model aircraft, with Noah's gliding an incredible 120m! The week 4 group had the opportunity to view 2 Lancair aircraft come in to land at the Port Pirie Aerodrome.



This is significant as the latest addition to our course is a Lancair kit that the student's are building together in the engineering part of the course. The students were welcomed by the pilots to view their aircraft up close and personal, and ask all of the questions they could think of. These students were also able to continue the drone's component of the course by completing precise circuits which demonstrate the student's control from a single point.

Remote Control aircraft were also introduced this term, allowing the student's another layer of understanding to the theory of flight and how an aeroplane's control surfaces interact with the air they fly through.


#### **ROAD SAFETY CENTRE**

On 21 March, the Australian Law Reform Commission released a set of recommendations that are an appalling attack on faith and freedom of belief in Australia. If the Government accepts these ALRC recommendations, it means Christian schools won't have the freedom to preference people who share the same Christian values and beliefs when making employment decisions.

As Paul Kelly also noted,"Religious education, its communities and parental discretions would be weakened long term." You can read more ont he My Christian School Website. The good news is the Federal Government has not yet made its position clear but we need to send a clear message to the Prime Minister that Christian schools must be able to employ people who share our faith.

Faith In Our Future is a town hall event that will bring together supporters of Christian schools and their representatives in parliament.

These events are an opportunity to share about the impact of Christian faith in our schools, to share our concerns with our Federal political representatives and ask for their support.
