Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Any time that God says something three times in the Bible, particularly in one story, you know it is very important. In this case, it is the phrase, "love one another". Over the past two weeks, I have attended two very different events, and this phrase came up in both and has made me reflect afresh on our theme of "One Another".

The first event was the Remembrance Day Service in Port Pirie. It is action that goes beyond what makes me happy, action that goes beyond what is best for me, action that demonstrates that someone else is more important than me – that is love for one another.

I have once again been reminded, challenged, and inspired to love others, as Christ has loved me. Let us look for opportunities to love one another in ways that others will know that we are His disciples.



### **CHRISTMAS DONATIONS**


